Its back and its better than ever! The Westcott Theater, formerly the Westcott Cinema, is going to be the new home to national, regional, and local music in Syracuse!

Yes that's right boys and girls, no more hoping that the large venues like the Landmark Theater and the War Memorial will host a good band or two throughout the entire winter, and no more being restricted inside a small bar. The Westcott Theater brings promise of new musical life in the Syracuse area, something that is truly long overdue.

Bands such as Ryan Montbleu Band, Hot Tuna, Soulive, U-Melt, and Giant Panda Guerilla Dub Squad will be able to come to the Syracuse area to play for their many fans in a venue that fits them perfectly. Originally built in 1926 as The Harvard, the theater has seen a variety of names and owners but it had never seen live music until September 21st when the doors were opened as The Westcott Theater.

This time music is going to be the primary entertainment of the theater with a secondary emphasis on art such as film festivals. The venue is large on the inside and the seats have been removed to provide ample space for dancers or even a mosh pit. The stage is raised about four feet and the lighting that they have is spectacular. Plus with the addition of the new, retractable cinema screen I can totally envision crazy light show capabilities. Most of all, the venue is now home to a bar with an excellent selection of your favorite brews.

## The Resurgence of Vinyl by Alex Suskind

23-year-old Ken Rieke is flipping through a stack of vinyl records in the back room of a Ramada Inn in Syracuse. He moves briskly through several milk crates, glancing at each record as it passes through his fingers. Rieke, along with hundreds of other music lovers, have come out for the bi-annual CD and Record Fair.

It seems odd that someone as young as Rieke is still listening to vinyl. Most people his age were born while the record had already begun to decline in popularity.

"I am a fan of having something tangible," said Rieke, who has been buying records for the past two years.

Rieke is not the only young person buying vinyl these days. Despite the continued success of digital music, the LP, a piece of plastic that you can't fit in your pocket and listen to on the treadmill, has surprisingly seen a recent resurgence in sales.

In 2007, vinyl sales totaled 990,000 units, according to Nielsen Soundscan. However, in only the first six months of 2008, that number totaled 803,000 – a 77% increase from the same time the year before. At this rate, the final 2008 sales numbers will be twice the amount of 2007's.

It might seem crazy that someone would go to such great lengths to buy something they could find in a few seconds on the Internet. However, there are a number of potential reasons as to why this trend has suddenly sprung up: better sound quality; the free download with purchase; or the nostalgic feeling of holding a record, looking at the artwork on the cover and being able to watch it play and produce sound right in front of you are all possibilities.

Check us out on the internet www.cnylive.net myspace.com/cnylivenet "I think what is happening...whenever a medium really goes away there tends to be a period where...its always good riddance; we want the new thing," said Bob Thompson, the founding director of the Bleier Center for Television and Popular Culture at Syracuse University. "Then there is a period where people begin to rediscover some of the advantages [the] old medium had that the new medium doesn't."

The fact that sales have dramatically increased over the past two years is remarkable. The vinyl record as a symbol of music culture ended more than two decades ago with the launch of the CD in 1982.

The story of the vinyl record began almost a century before that, in 1887 when Emil Berliner invented the gramophone. The gramophone read music through the grooves on a flat disc (which would later be known as a record).

By 1948, a revolution in music was born with the introduction of the LP (long-playing album). It became the face of music culture for the next three decades. From there on out, the record faded into a nostalgic artifact.

"There are a lot of young people who never grew up with LP's who are getting into this, and I think that is partly because it's this kind of subculture that is interesting," Thompson said.

"I feel like [vinyl] is coming back because it has become more of a fad," Rieke said. "People want to be old school, [they are like] 'oh lets go out and get vinyl'."

Looking past the "coolness" factor, one of the possible advantages a record has is higher sound quality.

CDs and iPods use a compressed form of audio that eliminates the richness in sound that you would otherwise have in an uncompressed format. There is a loss of sound when you compress things. However, the sound on vinyl is uncompressed.



"For my ears [vinyl] sounds better," said Don Van Cleave, president of the Coalition of Independent Music Stores. "Kids your age didn't grow up with sound quality being part of their lives...a lot of your generation are listening to mashed down MP3s that don't sound good."

One of the original complaints of vinyl was the presence of pops and clicks in the sound– a reason why CDs became so popular in the 1980s. Yet, some music lovers complained about the inauthentic and pristine sound that a CD produced. Without that popping and clicking noise, it seemed as if something was missing.

"It was almost like a drum roll," Thompson said. "When you first got a record out of the sleeve you would stick it onto a turntable, you would lower the needle, and then there would be that 'crshhkrrkhhh' sound. It made it more connective to the real world."

Mike Watson, a manager who works at Sound Garden, had other ideas for the sudden resurgence. "The reason I think [vinyl] is coming back so strongly, is because a lot of the bigger conglomerates that press the vinyl are now putting in download cards so it does appeal to this generation," Watson said. The download cards give the listener an opportunity to download a digital version of the album. The cards were never offered with CDs since you can import the songs from a CD onto your computer.

Offering download cards with records seem like a logical step in order to boost sales. In 2007 alone, 844.1 million songs were downloaded, according to Nielsen Soundscan. The ability to download the album in combination with the sound quality can make vinyl attractive to the younger generation.

In the end, the advantages records have over their digital counterpart are open to question. Despite this, there is still no concrete answer as to why this resurgence is happening right now. Only time will tell if this renewed fascination is a passing fad or the start of something new.

"It is not as though the music industry is going to be reclaimed by vinyl, I mean this is always going to be a specialized thing," Thompson said. "It is nice to know there [are] actually...[bands] who are still recording on it. They will have to keep manufacturing turntables which means you can kind of keep that medium alive in a way that some media have completely disappeared."



#### Cardinals featuring Ryan Adams Sept 26 - Landmark Theatre by Alex Suskind

"Oh my god there is like a pack of wild animals in here," said Ryan Adams, halfway into his hour and a half set at the Landmark Theater. The singer jokingly added that the crowd sounded like a group of teenagers with Budweiser, giving the rambunctious [and certainly intoxicated] audience a reason to yell even louder.

Regardless, Adams, along with his backing band the Cardinals, soaked up the vociferous atmosphere and put on an entertaining show, playing both new and old material for the Syracuse faithful.

As the house lights dimmed, two large neonblue roses illuminated the theater. Adams, sporting a leather jacket and Buddy Hollystyled glasses, stepped onstage with his band. They opened with Cobwebs, an uptempo song with a steady drumbeat and overlapping guitars.

In addition to Cobwebs, Adams played several songs that are scheduled to appear on his new album Cardinology due out Oct. 28th, including the foot-stomping rock anthem Magick, the Neil Young inspired Fix It, and the emotionally slow-tempo Like Yesterday. Despite the fact that half of the audience sat for the show, the majority of the crowd responded well to the new material. "It was great...the guitars were incredible," said Terry Scanlon on Adams' performance. Matt Wheeler, who sat a few seats down from Scanlon chimed in as well. "This is the kind of show we need in Syracuse," he said.

Although the theater was partially empty, it did not seem to deter Adams and his band. They sounded on point throughout the night as fans danced and sang along to some of his older material such as Come Pick Me Up off of his solo debut album Heartbreaker and La Cienga Just Smiled from the 2001 album Gold.

Adams and the Cardinals finished off their first set with Freeway to the Canyon, a song by singer-songwriter Neal Casal, who doubles as the guitarist for the Cardinals. At the end of the song the Landmark crowd, which had been rowdy throughout the night (even when Adams attempted to talk between songs), was given a challenge to be silent for 57 seconds. The silence lasted for about two seconds as the band laughed and stepped off stage for a twenty minute intermission.

Adams opened the second set with Crossed Out Name from the upcoming Cardinology, then slowed things down with a powerful version of Blue Hotel off the Follow the Lights EP released last October.

The highlights of the second set came when Adams' broke into his cover version of Wonderwall by Oasis from his 2004 release Love is Hell. The audience sang along with Adams as he strummed on his acoustic guitar.

After another slow song, Adams kicked it up a notch with some excellent guitar playing on Cold Roses. The Cardinals helped add harmonies to the chorus "Daylight comes in exposin'/Saturday bruises and cold roses."

The band finished the night with 2004's I See Monsters. The entire theater was on there feet as they ended the show with a powerful jam. It was a solid performance from Adams, who is still considered one of the best in the alternative country genre that he has helped popularize.




